Chairman Rasmussen called the regular meeting of the Wright County Supervisors to order at 9:00 a.m. Members present were Rasmussen, Helgevold, and Watne.

Minutes of the previous regular meeting were read and approved.

Approved claims for payment.

Jason Schluttenhofer, Wright County Sheriff, presented information concerning TAC.10 Software for the Sheriff's department. The CAD software would be purchased by the E911 board and would be the base system in the Communication department and paid with grant money of about \$26,000.00. The county's software is an estimated cost of about \$78,000. This includes software for the Jail. At this point, the Supervisors are in agreement for moving forward toward the purchase of the new software and to have the Sheriff talk to the individual cities to see if they also have an interest towards this software. The entire project cost including the Mobile Dispatch would be \$181,295.00. There will be continued discussions about changing to this software.

Brad Hicks, Wright County Economic Development Director, presented information concerning becoming a Home Base Iowa Employer. Wright County did apply to be a Skilled Iowa Employer. Motion by Watne and seconded by Rasmussen to sign up Wright County to be a Home Base Iowa Employer. Motion carries unanimously.

Deb Lukes, Wright County Drainage Deputy, presented the improvement petition for DD #35. Deb informed the board that a petition was filed to enlarge the tile or create an open ditch to improve drainage within sections 16, 21, 27, & 28 of Iowa Township. The petition was signed by 5 of the 9 landowners within the district. There are 612 acres within Drainage District No. 35. Motion by Watne and seconded by Helgevold to receive the Petition for Improvement and appoint Kieth Hubbard of McClure Engineering to investigate the district and prepare a report. Motion carries.

Motion by Helgevold and seconded by Watne to adjourn the meeting. Motion carries.
